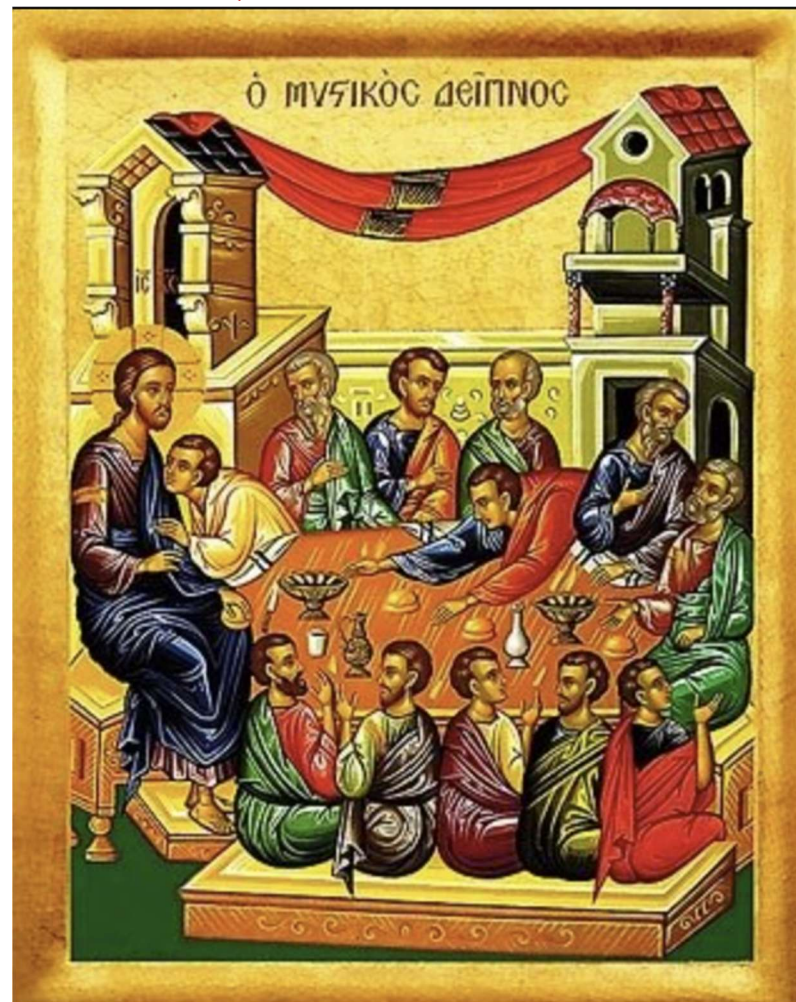

Now at that time He [Jesus] said to him, "A man once gave a great banquet and invited many. ¹⁷ And at the time for the banquet he sent his servant to say to those who had been invited, 'Come, for everything is now ready.' ¹⁸ But they all alike began to make excuses. The first said to him, 'I have bought a field, and I must go out and see it. Please have me excused.' ¹⁹ And another said, 'I have bought five yoke of oxen, and I go to examine them. Please have me excused.' ²⁰ And another said, 'I have married a wife, and therefore I cannot come.' ²¹ So the servant came and reported these things to his master. Understanding the Church Year ✱ **Trinity Season: Time by Seasons**

Both the secular calendar and the church calendar count time by the seasons. The secular calendar has four seasons: winter, spring, summer and fall. The seasons of nature are quite important to the way the church has constructed its seasons. However, the church seasons center moreso around the life and teachings of our LORD Jesus Christ. Advent [December] is the first season of the church's year, followed by Christmas/Epiphany [Winter], then Pre-Lent/Lent/Holy Week, then Easter [Spring] which includes Ascension and Pentecost, and finally Trinity season [Summer, Fall].
